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Below are some questions to reflect on from this piece. Feel free to also use one as a conversation starter with a fellow reader, or even a loved one on the outside!

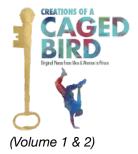
How has reading – whether poetry or prose, fiction or nonfiction – helped to shape your judgment? Has the experience of reading others' words ever led you to change your mind?
