When people learn that I've been incarcerated for 37 years, they often ask how I did it while appearing unscathed. If I had to sum it up in one word I'd say "judgment", the consequential prison GPS.

Coming to prison at such a young age having a life sentence, I disregarded judgment and embodied my environment. After reaching the lows I deeply regret, I literally and figuratively fell into a deep hole. My lapse in judgment had cataclysmic repercussions before becoming the wake-up call I desperately needed.

Sitting in the pit created by me, I faced a stark introspection which led to a complete self-destruction. As I was stripped bare, my sense of judgment was heightened. Deep down I found the moral principles and core values my mother put there years ago, and they would prove to be vital in a life changing reconstruction.

To create a healthy foundation, I had to release the baggage that impacted me for decades, and forgiveness turned out to be the cathartic growth I needed. Judgment not only became paramount in the process of eliminating everything/ everyone that could impede my development, it's now the filter for how I live my life.
